


#### There are various visual aids

Selecting the appropriate media

long term media	– poster	orientation
	<ul> <li>flipchart</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>discussion paper</li> </ul>	
short term media	<ul> <li>PPT slides</li> </ul>	explanation
	- transparencies	
	– video	
variable media	<ul> <li>metaplan pinboard</li> </ul>	process documentation
	<ul> <li>chalk board/whiteboard</li> </ul>	
	- flipchart	

### Media design: basic principles



Content	<ul> <li>reduce to the max</li> <li>use meaningful headlines</li> <li>use key words, not sentences</li> </ul>
Construction	<ul> <li>clear arrangement</li> <li>rather visuals than text</li> <li>sparing, supportive use of animation</li> </ul>
Fonts	<ul> <li>large (&gt;18)</li> <li>sans serif, e.g. Arial (rather than serif fonts)</li> <li>mix capital and small letters</li> <li>max 2 different fonts and <u>highlights</u></li> </ul>
Color	<ul> <li>meaningful variation and accentuation</li> <li>contrast: dark fonts on light background</li> </ul>

### Some good advice for presenting slides



- 1. Reduce the overall number of slides.
- 2. Take your time while presenting complex slides.
  - → announce show give time to look explain
- 3. Have a short break during slide transitions.
- 4. Integrate "no-show" episodes.
  - ➔ e.g., black/white screen while giving a practical example,
- 5. Vary media.
  - → e.g., chalk board, flip chart, ...
